The Buckingham Continues Outreach Program to Brookwood Community

The Brookwood Community is a God-centered educational, residential, and entrepreneurial community for adults with functional disabilities located in Brookshire, Texas, just west of Houston. Mission-spirited teachers work with the Brookwood citizens to provide an environment of supervised independence. Brookwood provides opportunities to live, to learn, to work, and to play. Designed to provide "life" opportunities which promote self esteem. Brookwood enterprises include hand crafts (candles, ceramics, screen printing, garden sculpture, and stone casting), horticulture, retail stores, and the Cafe at Brookwood with entrees prepared by a gourmet chef and staff.

The Buckingham volunteers have an opportunity to participate and support the Brookwood Community by volunteering on the second Monday of each month from 9:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Volunteers will put their talents to work cleaning or painting ceramics and stonecast pottery. These products will be offered at the Brookwood retail stores which, helps support the Brookwood Community. If you are interested in spending quality time with your friends and making new friends, be sure to sign up for this space limited outreach project. We will lunch at the Brookwood Café on Monday, June 14.



Wallace and Betty Brunson are amongst the earliest residents at The Buckingham. They moved into their Apartment # 1418 on June 23rd 2005. They have very kindly agreed to be interviewed for the Crowne News.

Crowne: Are either of you native Houstonians or native Texans?

Wallace: Both of us were born in Houston and I grew up in Baytown and Betty grew up in Houston.

Crowne: Do you have any brothers or sisters?

Betty: I had 2 brothers but they are now dead.

Wallace: I had 2 brothers both younger than me, but one died in 1992, the other lives in Austin and visits us.

Crowne: Where did you go to school?

Betty: I went to Lamar High School and went on to University of Texas and studied Education.

Wallace: I went to schools in Baytown and first year of college I attended New Mexico Military Institute; you didn't have to walk, you rode a horse and I liked that. When I returned to Texas I enrolled at the University of Texas and thought I would be an engineer, but I ran into Calculus and decided to become a geologist instead. I had been around the oil business a bit, my father had drilled some wells, and I liked studying geology very much. I got my Bachelors degree in 1942 and my Masters degree in 1954.

During W.W.II I trained people in photo laboratory work, concerned with photographic reconnaissance for the Air Force. After that I worked for a while with my father in the movie theatre business; he had a number of theatres. I was recalled into the air force for the Korean war, as I was on the reserve. I was sent to Korea and ran the Photo Lab, having 147 enlisted men and 5 officers under me. We took pictures of North Korea every day, processed them and passed them on to intelligence to look at, we were really busy.

Crowne: What did you want to do or be in life?

Betty: I wanted to be a teacher and Wallace wanted to be a Geologist.

Crowne: Where and when did you meet?

Wallace: We were both taking a summer course at University of Houston.

Crowne: When and where were you married?

Wallace: We were married at Christ Church in Houston on September 3rd 1942. Betty was 20 and I was 22.

Crowne: Do you have any children?

Betty: Yes, we had 2, a daughter and a son. Our daughter died 6 years ago but our son lives in Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Crowne: Was your daughter married and did she have children?

Wallace: She was married but had no children.

Crowne: And your son is he married?

Wallace: Yes, he is married and has a 22 year old son who lives in Los Angeles, California.

Crowne: Do you get to see them often?

Wallace: Well all the family were here last week and had dinner with us.

Crowne: Where have you lived?

Wallace: Starting in Baytown, then Austin, then Lubbock, then Fort Worth and then Houston in 1971. After I got my Masters Degree I went to work as a geologist with Amoco and stayed with them until I retired in 1980.

Crowne: Were you active in the Geological Societies?

Wallace: Yes, prior to returning to Houston I was Past President of the Lubbock Geological Society. I was Editor of the Fort Worth Geological Society News Letter, and I was Past President of the Southwest Section of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists.

Crowne: Where did you live immediately prior to coming to The Buckingham?

Wallace: In Briargrove Park, which we moved to in 1975.

Crowne: What were your fondest childhood memories?

Wallace: I was raised in Baytown and we all had boats. We would ride on surf boards pulled behind the boats; I could do it standing on my head! We also did a lot of fishing. We saw a lot of movies as I didn't have to pay, because my father owned the theatres. In my late teens 3 of my friends and I used to go ballroom dancing and we really liked the big bands which came and played down here.

Betty: I loved shopping.

Crowne: What about adult memories?

Betty: When Wallace was called up in W.W.2 he was posted to Boca Raton, Florida and I went there also. After 6 weeks he was sent up to Yale University in Connecticut to receive his commission, and I was asked to drive another cadet's wife up there in her car, as she couldn't drive. It was quite an adventure, staying at guest houses on the way, but we made it.

Crowne: What do you think about life today?

Wallace: I do not think it as good today or as safe. I am not happy with our government and the way things seem to be going. I worry about our constitution and the possibility that our politicians, at some time in the future, will try to unite Canada, America and Mexico into one country.

Crowne: Would you like to be a 9 year old setting out on life today?

Wallace: No, neither of us would like to do that, we are satisfied with the wonderful lives we have had.

Crowne: What are some of the things you have enjoyed doing?
